In 2024 it awarded 70 Home Improvement Grants = £103.464.75 & **54** Financial Grants = **£45.387** to a total of £148,851.75.

For Annual Beneficiaries, 94 Adults & Children received Xmas Gifts = £17,345 and 90 received Birthday presents = £19,785 to a total of £37,130.

It also provides visits from members of the Care & Support Team; a Telephone Befriending Service & where necessary Respite Care.

The Welfare & Benefits Advisor

Between Sept 2021 & Jan 2025 Claire Beaumont provided advice & assistance to those receiving / qualified to receive State Benefits to claim a total of £1,288,874.30. They will receive these benefits for rest of their lives.

West Riding Masonic Community Fund (Formerly PGM Fund)



WRMCF is a fund derived from donations made by local brethren which WRMCL administers & allocates for the benefit of the wider community.

Since its inception in 1986 (as The PGM's Fund) it has awarded a total of 3,911 Financial Awarded Grants (3,806 Minor Grants and 105 Major Grants) to a total of £5,406,842.56

In 2024 it awarded 59 Minor Grants = £94,555.97 and 4 Major Grants = £57,995. to a total of £157,850.97.

Grant Applications

Following due diligence any Lodge or Chapter may submit an application for a Major or Minor Grant each being considered on its own merits.

Minor Grants (generally up to £5.000) may be applied for at any time & are considered regularly by the Funds Committee, Major Grants (1 or more grants totalling approx. £100,000) are awarded annually, Applications to be submitted by 28th February.

The RMBI Care Co is a major provider of high-quality care services for over 1000 older Freemasons and their families, whilst supporting many more. They accommodate people requiring residential or nursing care and a Dementia Support House has been created at several of their 17 Care Homes nationwide.

MCF, the national masonic charity is one of the largest grant-making charities in the country.

In 2023/24 it awarded £13.7m to 3,036 Freemasons & families through 4575 grants - £8.2m for essential daily living costs; £4.4m for health, care and wellbeing & £1.1m for help with young people in education.

It supported a range of health needs including counselling, medical treatments & with 1,061 visits to applicants by 286 trained Visiting Volunteers and with 17,815 interactions with those requiring support. It also provided £6.9m funding for respite, residential, nursing & dementia care at the RMBI Care Co. homes.

It helped vulnerable & disadvantaged people to live happy, fulfilling lives & participate actively in society through grants to local & national charities & partnerships with leading organisations in the sector. It supported 339 local & national charities annually at a cost of £5.7m and being partnered with Age UK it is tackling loneliness & isolation in later life by funding charities that help people overcome barriers so they can actively participate in society in their later years.
